TO VISITING CORRESPONDENTS

You will find that Puerto Rico, although handicapped by severe natural limitations, is a country which has made considerable progress in the past quarter century because of the determination, capacity for change and creative intelligence of its people. This progress, indeed impressive, is only the beginning, as Puerto Rico must now struggle even harder against a growing population, existing pockets of poverty, and the recent economic stagnation brought about by the recession.

These challenges of the future will be dealt with as we have dealt with past problems; in the spirit of openness, honesty and mutual respect that characterizes Puerto Rican political and social life. The profound faith of our people in the democratic process is the bedrock of our development.

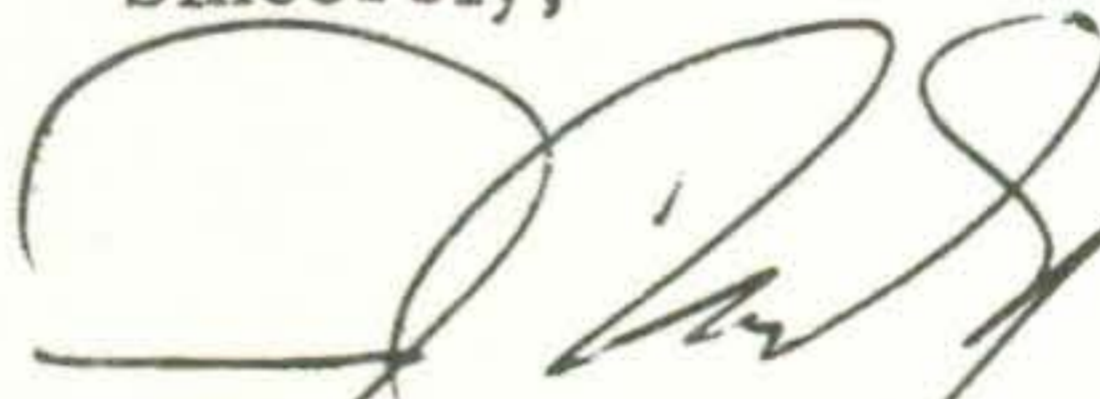
